RADF2023-24003	Mr Paul ANDREW	Strengthening Artist Run Communities - Artist Residency STRENGTHENING ARTIST-RUN COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE significantly expands the ARI REMIX COMMUNITY ARCHIVES PROJECT [2011-2023] which maps untold stories and hidden histories of Queensland artist-run culture and heritage by drawing on the foundations of the 1970s experimental art ecology. ARI Remix is a 'living archives' conceptualized in the form of a participatory internet artwork and heritage study resource. This new project encompasses a self-directed artist residency in Dublin, Ireland to grow and amplify the ARI REMIX Project and to significantly expand expertise in novel web-based archival art initiatives, to make a residency-focused artist book and develop new ARI memory work collaborations.	\$5,000

Bolster's skilled facilitation of 20 years ensures dynamic and pragmatic workshops, nurturing a positive mindset and reinforcing emotional well-being among the attendees. The program's primary objective is cultivating a resilient and empowered community, equipping individuals with the tools to navigate life's challenges with grace, empathy, and an optimistic outlook - and connecting to the heart.	\$5,000
